

WHAT IS COVERED BY PCN?

PCN covers primary care (what your doctor can do for you in his office), limited prescription costs and limited emergency medical services.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR PCN?

To qualify, you must:

- Be age 19 through 64
- Be a U.S. citizens or legal resident
- Be uninsured
- Meet income guidelines
- There are no asset limits
- Not be qualified for Medicaid or have access to student health insurance, Medicare or Veterans benefits

WHAT IS DISABILITY MEDICAID?

Medicaid is a health care program for families and individuals with low income and limited resources.

Disability Medicaid provides coverage for individuals with disabilities. An individual with a disability may also receive additional Medicaid benefits.

Medicaid defines a disability as the “inability to do any substantial gainful activity.” This includes a medically determinable physical or mental impairment which:

- Can be expected to result in death
- Or has lasted or can be expected to last for 12 months or longer

WHAT IS COVERED BY DISABILITY MEDICAID?

Disability Medicaid offers the same health care benefits as other Medicaid programs. (See “*What is Medicaid?*” Brochure)



WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To qualify for a Medicaid program you must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or qualified resident alien (unless applying for emergency services only)
- Meet income and asset limits
- Be a Utah resident

In addition to meeting these general requirements, you must also have a disability.

If you have been recognized by the Social Security Administration as having a disability, you will qualify for Disability Medicaid.

If you have a condition that has not been recognized as a disability or you are unsure if you are eligible, follow these steps to finding out if you meet the disability qualifications:

1. Call or visit a Department of Workforce Services location to speak with an

eligibility worker, and tell them you want to apply for Disability Medicaid.

2. You will need to provide information about yourself — income, assets and citizenship — and also information about your medical history. If you are asked to go to a doctor for an exam, the State can pay for the exam.
3. A Disability Review Board will review your medical information to decide if you meet the disability requirements.

If you are eligible for Disability Medicaid, you may also need to apply for income benefits from Social Security.

If you think you might be eligible, you can apply for Disability Medicaid at any time by contacting or visiting any Department of Workforce Services location. See back of brochure for more information on how to apply for Disability Medicaid.

WHAT IS THE PRIMARY CARE NETWORK (PCN)?

If you are not eligible for a Medicaid program, you may still qualify for PCN. PCN is a health care plan for uninsured adults that covers services administered by a primary care provider. You may only apply for PCN during open enrollment periods.

A disability or medical need is not required to be eligible for PCN. Co-payments are required for some services like visits to a primary care provider.
