Medicaid Justice Re-entry Stakeholder Workgroup Meeting Minutes November 6, 2024

Introductions and last meeting recap

• Meeting minutes from October 2, 2024 kickoff meeting found here.

• Program description

- The Medicaid justice benefit is a robust Medicaid package that will allow
 Medicaid coverage for all qualifying inmates 90 days prior to release.
- o Facilities can bill Medicaid for all qualifying services.
 - A re-entry initiative that will allow incarcerated individuals to re-enter society with the necessary support and coverage in order to meet individual needs and serve the Social Determinants of Health.

Goals


- Improve access to services and continuity of care.
- o Improve coordination and communication through re-entry.
- Reduce mortality.
- Reduce healthcare costs through emergency room diversion and inpatient stays.
- o Reduce rates of recidivism.
- o Improve community safety.

Program milestones

- Finalized implementation plan submitted to the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) on October 28, 2024.
 - CMS will take approximately 4-5 months to complete their review.
 - CMS approval is needed before "going live" with a carceral facility.
- Utah Medicaid posting an RFP for external consultants to assist with implementation.
- Federal grant opportunity (CMS):
 - CMS is awarding Medicaid agencies up to \$5 million in federal grant funds to be utilized for the development of operational capabilities that will allow for a successful implementation of justice-involved initiatives with no match required.
 - If awarded, Utah Medicaid intends on distributing the funds to non-federal correctional facilities across the state through an RFP process based on current readiness and ability to implement both now and in the future.

■ The anticipated award date for the first of two cohorts: February 15, 2025.

Current status and proposed timeline



• Correctional Facility Readiness Assessment

- Survey distributed to correctional facilities on December 2, 2024.
- Used to assess a facility's readiness to implement justice-involved program requirements.
 - Will be used as a collaborative tool designed to aid Medicaid in providing targeted assistance and trainings to facilities to meet requirements.
 - Medicaid will be offering DAILY TA support for facilities who are filling out the assessment.
- General components:
 - Medicaid enrollment/application process
 - 90-day pre-release eligibility and behavioral health screening
 - 90-day pre-release service delivery
 - Re-entry planning and coordination- care management role
 - Oversight and project management
 - Participating provider

Screening for Medicaid eligibility

- Developing standardized process and pathway for required information to be submitted to DWS.
 - Exploring a centralized database to capture all correctional facility eligibility information.
