Settings that Demonstrated Compliance by July 1, 2021

On March 17, 2014, new federal Medicaid rules for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) went into effect. The rules impact many parts of HCBS. One of the most important topics is the places where HCBS can be provided.

Because HCBS programs are offered as alternatives to nursing and intermediate care facility services, the new rules make sure that HCBS are provided in settings that are not institutional in nature. To follow this rule, states must make sure that HCBS settings are part of a larger community, people are able to have choices about their service settings, and that people are assured their rights to privacy, dignity and respect.

States must evaluate their HCBS programs to determine the level of compliance with the new rules. The setting indicated on this form had initially been identified as requiring to go through the heightened scrutiny process as part of the compliance process. They were able to demonstrate compliance with the settings criteria by July 1, 2021, so they are not required to go through the entire heightened scrutiny process, but they are required to go out for public comment.

The setting requires better planning in regards to activities to make them more meaningful to individuals to ensure integration into the greater community; e.g. cooking classes located in one of the homes 2x/month.

Remediation Plan Summary:

- Community cooking classes offered through the National Ability Center, Heber Valley
 Medical Center and Utah Valley University Community have been attended and will
 continue, if individuals are interested. Cooking classes in the home are infrequent and
 typically spontaneous when weather is inclement.
- Weekly planning meetings are in place, where local events are discussed to see who is interested in participating in which class.
- Continue to provide a variety of activity options that reflect the personal preferences based on individuals' input.
- Continue to explore additional volunteer opportunities that may lead to competitive employment.
- Obtain documented permission from the residents of the home to hold a cooking class and utilize the kitchen twice a month, until community classes are available. (Residents of the home are present and involved in participating during classes)
- Disseminate additional information regarding HCBS settings rule to individuals and family members, discuss cultural and systemic changes to improve community integration.
- Provide training for all employees regarding HCBS settings rule.

Onsite Visit Summary (2021):

- Individuals are accessing the community regularly to eat out, go shopping, use community services such as salons and the bank, go to parks, and local events. More activities will be added as Danville reduces COVID-19 restrictions to include bowling, the library, National Abilities Center, etc.
- Individuals are able to interact with others at local events, make their own purchases and selections at stores, and volunteer.
- A cooking class takes place in the residence of three of the people at the day program.
 They have given written consent for this to take place. They are also asked verbally a day or so before the scheduled cooking class and if they do not want it held at their home they can state that and the class will be held somewhere else.
- Other options have been explored for cooking classes in the community, however they do not meet the dietary needs and interests of those interested in the class.
