Medicaid Reform 1115 Demonstration Amendment Overview



Twelve Month Extended Postpartum Coverage

- Resulting from Senate Bill 133 (2023 General Session) "Modifications to Medicaid Coverage"
- This amendment request seeks authority from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide twelve months of extended Medicaid coverage for certain postpartum women.
- Eligibility
 - Individuals must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify for twelve-month extended postpartum coverage:
 - The woman is eligible for Medicaid during her pregnancy; and
 - The woman's pregnancy ends by way of:
 - Birth
 - Miscarriage
 - Stillbirth; or
 - An abortion that is permitted under <u>Utah Code Section 76-7a-201</u>.
- Benefits
 - o There are no changes to the postpartum benefits provided to eligible individuals under this amendment. Individuals will continue to receive state plan postpartum benefits.
- Proposed Demonstration Timeframe
 - o The State intends to implement the coverage as soon as possible after approval.
- Population Impacted
 - o Approximately 8,400 individuals may be eligible per year if this amendment is approved.
