

Chronic Conditions Support

- Resulting from Senate Bill 269 (2023 General Session) “Chronic Conditions Support Amendment”
- This amendment request seeks authority from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to provide additional Medicaid services to fee for service enrolled individuals with qualified chronic health conditions.
- Eligibility
 - Individuals must meet the following eligibility criteria to qualify:
 - The individual has been diagnosed as having a qualified, chronic health condition;
 - The individual is not enrolled in an accountable care organization.
- Benefits
 - If approved under this demonstration, qualified Medicaid members will be eligible to receive the following services:
 - A telemedicine platform for the member to use;
 - An in-home initial visit to the member;
 - Daily remote monitoring of the members qualified condition;
 - All services in the member’s language of choice;
 - Individual peer monitoring and coaching for the member;
 - Available access for the member to video-enabled consults and voice-enabled consults 24 hours a day, seven days a week;
 - In-home biometric monitoring devices to monitor the member’s qualified condition; and
 - At-home medication delivery to the member.
- Proposed Demonstration Timeframe
 - The state intends to implement the Demonstration as soon as possible after approval. The state requests to operate the Demonstration for a three-year pilot program.
- Population Impacted
 - Approximately 1,350 individuals may be eligible per year if this amendment is approved.
