Utah Medicaid Early and Periodic Screening, **Diagnostic and** Treatment **Benefit**

Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) services are available at no cost to Medicaid members from birth through the month of their 21st birthday.

EPSDT Program Goal:

• The right care, to the right child, at the right time, in the right setting.

Benefits Include

- Well-child check-ups performed throughout a child's development:
 - Preventative Physical Exams
 - Hearing and Vision Screenings
 - Mental Health Care
 - Immunizations

Other Services Covered When Medically Necessary

- Health Screenings
- Physical Exams
- Vaccines
- Labs/Imaging
- Education about Health Topics
- Hearing Tests
- Dental Screenings and Preventative Care
- Vision Screenings

- Mental Health Screenings and Services
- Durable Medical Equipment and Medical Supplies
- Physical, Occupational, and Speech Therapy
- Interpretative Services
- Medical Transportation

The EPSDT Manual was updated in September. Changes Include:

- Inaccurate and/or outdated policy information has been removed or revised
- Additional state/federal program information has been added that may apply to members eligible for EPSDT benefits

- Additional services that are covered by Utah Medicaid for EPSDT eligible members but have not been detailed in historic versions of the manual have been added including:
 - Non-emergency medical transportation services
 - Interpreter Services
 - Medical appointment assistance and appointment follow-up services provided by local health departments

Promoting EPSDT Awareness Best Practices

- Use clear language when informing policies
- Have transportation app
- Offer scheduling assistance
- Care coordination
- Provide EPSDT training
- Work with MCE's to implement best practices

Expanding and Using the Children-Focused (EPSDT) Workforce Best Practices

- Incorporate Oral health into primary care visits
- Enroll out-of-state providers
- Adopt the Collaborative Care Model (CoCM) for interprofessional consultation
- Review Payment Methodologies explore using differential rates

Improving Care for Children with Specialized Needs Best Practices

- Create a seamless and comprehensive behavioral health system for children
- Managed care plans assign a liaison and trauma-informed care manager to children in foster care
- Coordinate programs for children with disabilities or other complex health needs and provide them with a broad range of non-medical services.
