Changes to Point of Sale Medicare Part B/D Pharmacy Claims for Medicaid fee-for-service (FFS) dual eligible recipients

Beginning December 1, 2017, Utah Medicaid FFS will deny Medicare Part B/D drugs at point of sale for dual eligible members (Medicare/Medicaid). These Medicare Part B/D drug claims must be submitted to the dual eligible's Medicare plan.

If the Medicare Part B/D drug is a Part B covered benefit, Medicaid will reimburse under coordination of benefits as noted in the Utah State Plan, Attachment 4.19-B. For billing Medicare/Medicaid crossover claims, please see Section 1: General Information in Utah's Provider Manual, Section 11-5.1 Medicare Crossover Claims for more information.

If the Medicare Part B/D drug is a Part D covered benefit, outpatient prescription drugs will not be covered by Utah Medicaid.

Medicare Part B/D drugs may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Prescription nebulized solutions (e.g., tobramycin, pentamidine, sodium chloride, ipratropium, cromolyn, albuterol, arformoterol, formoterol, levalbuterol)
- Hepatitis vaccines
- Oral oncology drugs (e.g., cyclophosphamide, temozolomide, methotrexate, leucovorin)
- Oral corticosteroids (e.g., dexamethasone, methylprednisolone, prednisolone, prednisone)
- Insulin (e.g., Lantus, Humulin, Humalog, Novolin, Novolog)
- Anti-nausea drugs (e.g., dolasetron, granisetron, ondansetron)
- Oral immunosuppressive drugs (e.g., mycophenolate, everolimus, sirolimus, tacrolimus, azathioprine)
